Qualifying air-source heat pumps can efficiently heat and cool your home with one unit.


Time is running out on a long-standing federal tax credit for air-source heat pumps. The current \$300 tax credit is due to expire on Dec. 31. 2021. The tax credit also retroactively applies to new ASHPs installed in the 2018-20 tax years. Visit acrec.com/ electric-service for more information.




How Do Air-Source Heat Pumps Work?

By transferring heat between a house and outside air, these devices trim electricity use by as much as 30 percent to 40 percent in moderate climates.

SUMMER





Compressor

Increases refrigerant/freon pressure to accept the maximum heat from the air.

2) Condenser

Coils move freon (and with it, hot or cold air) to or from outside air.

3 Evaporator

Coils move freon (and with it, hot or cold air) to or from outside air.

4 Air Handler

Fan blows air into a home's ducts.


5 Reversing Valve

Switches the direction of the freon flow, changing the heat pump's output to hot or cold air (controlled by thermostat).


